

## CA Disclosure of Institutional Retention, Graduation and Transfer-out Rates

Retention rates measure the percentages of first-time students who return to the institution to continue their studies the following fall. Note that not all students at the institution are tracked for these rates. Students who have already attended another postsecondary institution are not included in this rate.

Retention Rates:

Full-time students: 100%

Part-time students: 76%



The overall graduation rate is also known as the "Student Right to Know" or IPEDS graduation rate. It tracks the progress of students who began their studies as full-time, first-time degree- or certificate-seeking students to see if they complete a degree or other award such as a certificate within 150% of "normal time" for completing the program in which they are enrolled.

Some institutions also report a transfer-out rate, which is the percentage of the full-time, first-time students who transferred to another institution.

Note that not all students at the institution are tracked for these rates. Students who have already attended another postsecondary institution, or who began their studies on a part-time basis, are not tracked for this rate.

*Context Notes:*

Interpret data with caution due to small cohort of Full-time, First-time students. The majority of ICE-CA's programs are offered as part-time schedules (less than 24 clock hours per week). The Student Right-to-Know Graduation Rate, which counts only a small population of first-time students in our full-time AOS programs, does not reflect the graduation rates across the majority of programs.
